rieda was born in Schenectady, New York. A 1918 graduate of Cornell University, she became a schoolteacher and, in 1923, married William D. Smith. They lived in Schenectady. The marriage ended in divorce.

Frieda then married Victor Starzenski, an engineer working in the field of gas and electricity. Like Frieda, he was divorced. Their son was Bruce Starzenski, and they lived first in Burnt Hills, New York, and later in the Village of Galway, a few miles to the north.

Frieda was active in educational and social causes, and also had an active social life. After Bruce was grown, she returned to teaching. She was the beloved Nonna (grandmother) to Bruce's family, and welcomed them to Little Strabla, the home she and Victor created in Galway. She died in 1984.

Sachsen Meinigen, Germany. Michael Klug was a
councilman in the local community, and the family was comfortably
situated.

The couple had ten children, but the names of only nine are known: Emma Marie (born 28 July 1840); Agnes (born 12 January1843); Otto (born 31 August 1843); Rudolph (born 15 April 1845, died May, 1893); Georg (born 7 September 1846); Leopold (born 28 August 1848); Ernst (born 7 August 1850); Helene (born 6 February 1854) and Anna (born 25 August, 1859).
